Although usually not immediately life-threatening, serious fractures can be fatal if not properly treated. This subcourse discusses the procedures for immobilizing fractures. Treat all suspected skeletal injuries, including fractures (broken bones), strains (stretched or torn muscles), sprains (stretched or torn ligaments), and dislocations (joints that are or were out of place), as if they are fractures until proved otherwise. The correct treatment for fractures is splinting. A properly applied splint stabilizes the bone in its normal anatomical position.
