

Download Clyde W. Sewell V. State Texas

Appellant did not testify but called three witnesses whose testimony was that the appellant did not and had not lived in the house searched, but was living at another place; that appellant's father, Clyde William Sewell, his wife and son resided there, and that the clothing and tickets had the father's name C.
