In physics, a phonon is a collective excitation in a periodic, elastic arrangement of atoms or molecules in condensed matter, specifically in solids and some liquids. The electron mobility is defined by the equation: $\mu = \frac{v_d}{E}$, where: E is the magnitude of the electric field applied to a material, v_d is the magnitude of the electron drift velocity (in other words, the electron drift speed) caused by the electric field, and
